Optical Fiber Under normal circumstances, the number of cores is equal to the number of terminals. However, we need to consider the redundancy during the design and construction of the actual scheme. So each terminal will use two cores at most. If you want to consider the cost, you can use 1-2 cores for the entire line redundancy.
