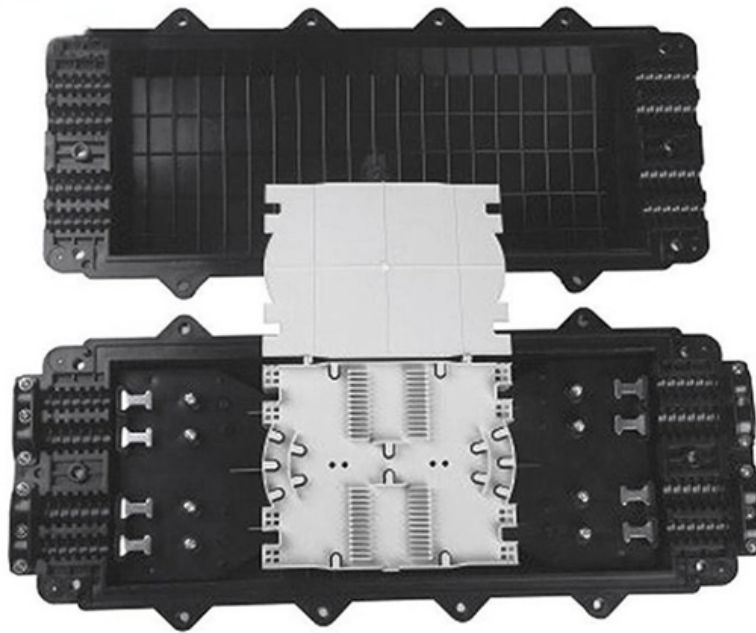

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How to Specify a Raised Access Floor: A

Specify raised access floor systems with fire-resistant properties, such as fire-rated panels and sealants. Ensure compliance with local fire safety
