In most cases, you see a red wire in an outlet box only in special circumstances. The red wire often appears as a puzzling element when opening a residential electrical box, especially since most household wiring relies on black, white, and bare copper. They help electricians know which wire does what, and they prevent mistakes that could cause. However I opened up the outlet and it looks like there's no red wire?

Is this normal and to be expected?
