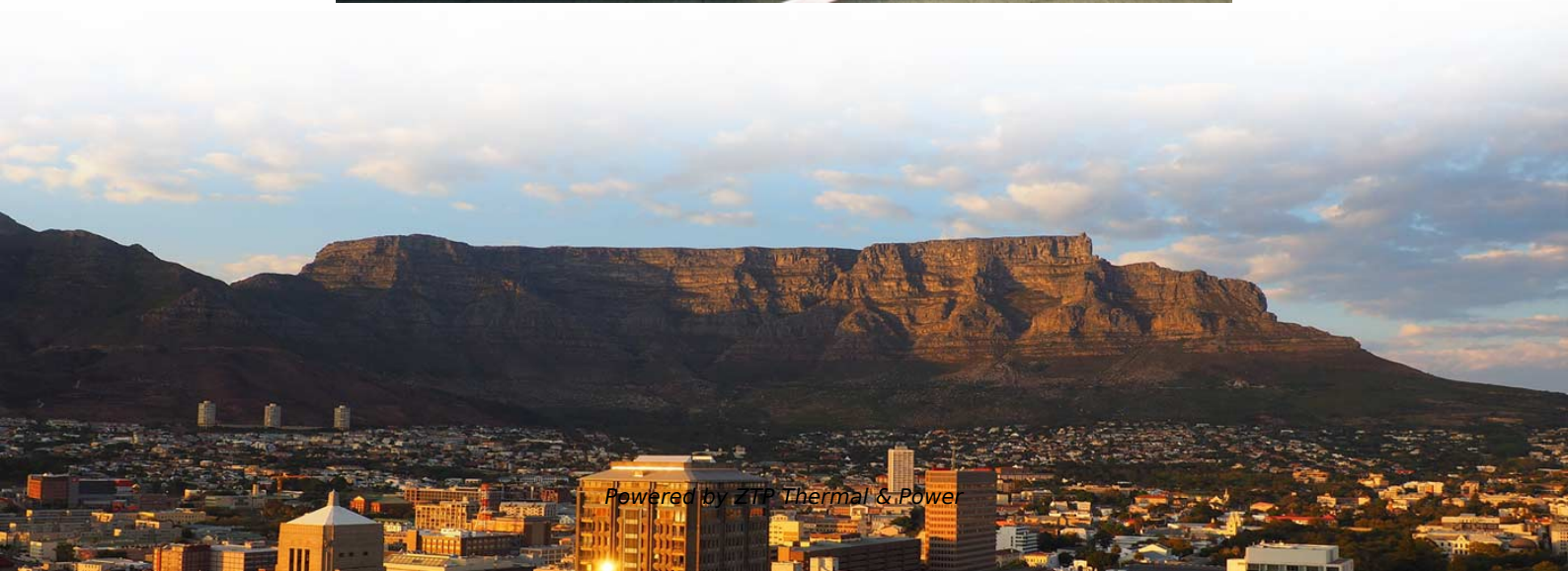

What does a yellow fiber optic cable mean?

The outer jacket color indicates the fiber's internal mode. A Yellow jacket universally signifies Single-mode fiber (OS1 or OS2), which has a 9µm core and is designed for long-distance, high-speed transmission using laser light sources. OS1 is used for indoor, tight-buffered cabling, while OS2 is used outdoors or in loose-tube designs.
