

What size support should be used for cable trays





Overview

The NEC requires that cable trays must be supported by members at an interval specified by the cable tray manufacturer, but not more than 5 feet for horizontal runs to support the weight of the cables and other loads. They are recommended for heavy cable runs as they provide good cable support as well as adequate ventilation. Wire Mesh Cable Trays are mainly used for telecommunication and fiber optic cables. The cable tray is made of a lightweight and easily rearrangeable design that can suit the various cable. A cable support system consists of cable support lengths and system components, such as cable support fittings, support elements, mounting elements and system accessories. For proper installation, design, and maintenance, adherence to international standards is essential. The mechanical and electrical characteristics, tests, certifications, overall quality management, recommendations mentioned in this technical guide only apply to our own cable management ranges and cannot under any circumstances be transposed to silicone, overheating or.
